EVP chapter visits

Visited the Arlingtones in May, and attended a concert in July.

Visited the DuPage Brat Bash in June.

Will visit the Brotherhood of Harmony in mid-September.

Will visit Rock River Valley after the convention.

The visits are a great way to stay in touch with members around the state and let them know what's going on with the Illinois District and BHS.

District Presidents' Council

I attended the in-person meetings at the mid-winter convention in San Antonio and at the international convention in Denver. District EVPs join the district presidents to get up to speed on what is transpiring in other districts, share ideas, and also represent the districts' wishes to BHS leaders.

There was a leadership class at Harmony University this summer, but unfortunately I was unable to attend. BHS is considering offering the class again, perhaps as early as at the mid-winter convention.

A few highlights from recent DPC meetings:

- BHS is looking into expanding insurance coverage to perhaps include repeat guests who have yet to join. The coverage would be incorporated into the existing insurance offered via BHS. Chapters will soon be asked to submit attendance records, to help identify how many guests (and members) attend. So if chapters aren't already tracking attendance, now is the time to start.
- At the international convention in July, BHS unveiled a great new video that expressed our new "branding anthem," In the Pursuit of Harmony. This doesn't replace Everyone In Harmony, but is designed to help us focus on actions. With that in mind, BHS is working on a voluntary Chapter Health Assessment that will be available for chapters to assess their goals, how their actions align with those goals, and how they might best be "in pursuit of harmony." It sounds like a really worthwhile tool! Chapter leaders will input data into a survey, and the software will offer suggested action steps, based on effective actions that similar chapters have found success with in the past.



Website

Here are the key items done since the HOD meeting in spring 2025:

- Promoted the international convention, encouraged members to go, and recognized our district representatives, New Tradition chorus and Onset quartet.
- Updated the site with information to promote the fall convention.
- Published spring and summer issues of “From the Vault.” A big thank-you to Rich Hansen.
- Updated some information on the members-only portion of the QCA section (Quartet Champions Association).
- Updated the site with new data, downloaded from the BHS members-only database:
 - Chapter officers, chapter/chorus contact information, and chorus rehearsal sites.
 - District officer and operations team information.
 - Active quartets.

We will upload the latest data from BHS to our district website prior to the fall convention.

- Periodically updated the messages on the yellow banner, the news events, and the calendar events to keep things current and make it convenient for site visitors to quickly find the latest information.

Social Media

- Continued to post and add followers on Instagram and Facebook, highlighting all the district and chapter goings-on that I became aware of. Kudos to the DuPage, Arlington Heights, Bloomington, and Chicago Metro chapters for making the district Facebook page a co-host for some events. This makes it easier for me to promote the events on behalf of the district; all chapters are encouraged to make the district an event co-host.

Greetings!

To say that my first contest as C&J has had a learning curve would be an understatement! I want to thank Jeff Lathom for helping me navigate thie intricacies of the job. There is more to it that I ever knew or even imagined.

As of the writing of this report we have 9 choruses and 16 quartets registered. Of those 16 quartets, 1 is a High School group and 2 are from Out of District. I do know of a couple more quartets that need to register. Hoping that number will be closer to 20 by the time it is all said and done.

We have decided to make a couple changes to the chorus contest this year. The first is that we are going to offer 2 different riser configurations. Those being 7 risers or 11 risers. Some of the smaller choruses felt as if they were too far removed from the audience when they are on 11 risers and I agree.

The second change is in the Plateau Award System. We felt that the system did not represent the District as it is currently composed. Many times we had 1 or no choruses in a given plateau. With these changes it should give choruses some competition within the plateaus and not just a participation trophy. The new plateaus are as follows:

4 A- Choruses that have averaged 74 or above over their last 2 contests within 5 years

3 A- Choruses that have averaged 65-73 over their last 2 contests within 5 years

2A- Choruses that have averaged 55-64 over their last 2 contests within 5 years



1A- Choruses that have averaged 54 or below over their last 2 contests within 5 years OR
Choruses that have not competed twice within the last 5 years.

We are also offering Choruses and Quartets the chance to get on stage before the contest. Choruses on Saturday morning from 8-10 in 15 min appointments. A letter will go out to all the choruses and the time slots will be available on a first come, first served basis. On Friday night the stage will be open from 3:30-4:30 for Quartets. This will be on a walk in basis. The mics will be shut off promptly at 4:30 so I suggest all quartets who want some time on the stage get there early and not wait until the very end.

The draw will take place on September 12th and will be broadcast live on our Facebook page. Hope some of you will tune in and join the fun!

Activities

Medals, Pins, Trophies for 2025

Medals for all registered categories have been ordered (and received) by Doug Ferrier w/ ribbons assigned by category: Blue (Quartet Champion), Red White Blue (Mixed, and High School), Light Blue (Seniors), Green (Novice), Purple (Next Generation).

Quartet Pins (1st, 2nd, 3rd) have been ordered (and received) by the Contest & Judging VP (Terry Ludwig, who gave them to Doug Ferrier)

Trophies for all categories have been engraved with previous year winner (or engraved by those who have the trophy: ABE – Jeff Bowyer, Seniors – Doug Smith, Mixed – Mitch Greenberg, Next Generation – Lindsay from sFourzando).

New Activities:

- We are **exploring** the idea of **reinstating chorus award pins (plateau winners, 1st/2nd/3rd place winners)**. These pins would not be year specific, but would be available to any first-time recipient within the Illinois District. Pins would be distributed to the President (or chorus director) after the contest, to be awarded at a later date in a special way of the chapter's choosing.
- Also **exploring** the option of retiring the current Seniors Trophy and **commissioning a new Seniors trophy** that will 1) Be lighter and less bulky for people to take with them 2) Make room for Winning Year – Quartet Name. Previous quartet winner names and year would be transferred to the new trophy.
- **Award for Barbershopping Excellence (A.B.E.)**

Our final clock (from a bulk supply) was given to our 2023 recipient. After a solicitation of several previous recipients in 2024, we determined that we will continue giving a clock to the recipients of the ABE to recognize their significant, sustained commitment to Barbershopping in the Illinois District. We will continue to purchase award clocks on an ad hoc basis (2024, 2025); however, will continue to look into another bulk order for future awards should it help us keep costs down.
